

The Goons scripts had been dismissed by Spike's original publisher as being difficult to put into a book. They were published more by accident than design. He was having dinner with his long time doctor, Dr Joseph Robson, and his wife, Charlotte, who had become family friends. (He dedicated Milliganimals to them). Spike found out their son Jeremy had just begun working in a publishing house and made the magnanimous gesture of promising him a book. Spike didn't have a book at the time but somewhere along the line the idea of the Goon Show Scripts came up. (Scudamore, 1985) (Farnes, 2003)

Jeremy had his book, the promise was kept and that was that. To everyone's surprise the book was very popular and soon there were reprints and a paperback edition with another new publisher Sphere Books.

Jeremy Robson set up his own publishing company and continued to be a publisher of Milligan for many years.

Published simultaneously in UK, USA, Australia. All look the same, but the Aussie one has its own ISBN.


