

Following the enormous success of the first volume of scripts a second volume was produced and was also a great success.

As with the first book of Goon Scripts, it was published in the UK, USA and Australia. The Australian version has its own ISBN, the US version is listed with the UK version's ISBN but a new twist, there are two separate publishers, St Martin's Press and Routledge Falmer both New York publishers at that time.

The Routledge Falmer edition is listed on OpenISBN as a paperback. I have also found one for sale as a paperback. However the physical description of the book given by the bookseller matches that of the hardback edition.
